Ancient Egyptians had pets, they particularly loved cats. Let's see now what relationship the Romans had with animals!



Look closely at this Roman roof tile. It was found here in Greenwich Park! Can you see the dog paw print? It tells us that Romans had dogs and that they were probably domesticated and were living close to them.

The Romans kept ferrets, monkeys, blackbirds, nightingales and parrots as pets. Large dogs would have been kept mainly as guard dogs, but they were also regarded as pets by their owners.
