

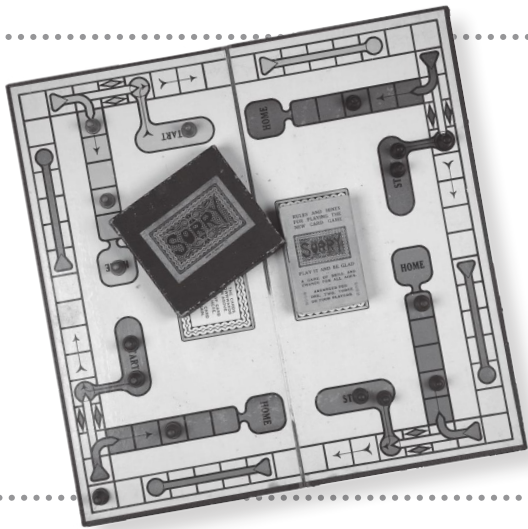


How did we play through time?
